One of my goals this year is to investigate as to whether "On-Line Giving" is something APC should pursue. As our world is increasingly digitized, "On-Line Giving" may assist in helping us to stay relevant and current, as well as up to date with other churches.

Conceptually "On-Line Giving" could be set up with a link from our church web site and/or promoted with the link mentioned in our weekly bulletins. A form would by filled in by the donor with such information as name, address, and other information. The donor would select what payment method he or she would like such as checking (ACH), savings, credit/debit card and then where those funds would be distributed; e.g., regular contributions, missions, capital funding, memorial gift, etc. Also, the donation could be a onetime donation or could be set up to be reoccurring for such things as pledging.

Please give me your thoughts on whether this service would be something you would find as a benefit. Would this help you with your pledging by not having to write a weekly or monthly check? Have You Ever Considered a Mission Trip?


